## **Featured Recipe:**

**Canning Red Beets** 

Beets Sugar 1cup vinegar 1 cup

Cut leaves off leaving about 1/2 inch stem Wash beets, put them in a pot of water and cook until soft After cooked run cold water over them, peel skin off Slice beets and put in jars.

Heat on the stove: 1cup sugar, 1 cup vinegar and 2 cups water Heat until boiling. If to sour and more sugar to taste Pour the mixture over beets in the jars. Put lids and ring on jars and place in canner Fill canner with water till water covers jars After water starts to boil, process for 15 min
