"This is how one should regard us servants of Christ and stewards of the mysteries of God"

1 Corinthians 4:1 ESV

"This is how one should regard us..." Paul is contrasting what he writes here with how the saints in Corinth were dividing themselves into factions, "I follow Apollos" or "I follow Paul" etc. They were seeing themselves as followers of a person instead of those persons helping them to follow Christ. Instead of seeing himself as one to be followed, he said, "This is how one should regard us, as servants of Christ, and stewards of the mysteries of God."

Sometimes, in churches, you might have a very energetic and popular leader who attracts a large following, and things may go well as long as that individual continues in that place. In the best of cases, that leader points those in his care to Christ, and His Word, and doesn't build the ministry around his own popularity. In the worst of cases, when that leader leaves, for whatever reason that might be, the ministry suffers and many leave and go elsewhere because "that guy" isn't there any longer. Paul didn't want that happening in Corinth, or anywhere else that he ministered for that matter, because he wanted the focus to be on Christ.

There are those, who, over the course of time, have helped us greatly in our walk with God, but who really personified that "servant of Christ" attitude, and the ministry didn't diminish significantly when they moved on. That is, I think, what Paul is trying to convey here. All those who ministered to the church in Corinth, whether Paul, or Apollos, Cephas (likely Peter) or whoever, they were all just servant shepherds who did their best to feed the flock under their care and point people to Christ.

The second part of that verse states that they should also be regarded as "stewards of the mysteries of God." This part was what raised my eyebrows when I read it. To be a steward of something, you are exercising care about its use; there's a sense of responsibility there, and perhaps some conservation of whatever the resource is. Then to be a steward of the mysteries of God, would mean to have great concern and care about how that is used, a carefulness in how it is expressed and how it is utilized by those with whom you share those mysteries.

And what are the mysteries of God? Paul writes in other letters, such as the letter to the church in Ephesus about how what had long been a mystery had now been made known through Jesus Christ. He writes about this in Eph. 3:1-13, and verses 4-6 particularly, "When you read this, you can perceive my insight into the mystery of Christ, which was not made known to the sons of men in other generations as it has now been revealed to his holy apostles and prophets by the Spirit. This mystery is that the Gentiles are fellow heirs, members of the same body, and partakers of the promise in Christ Jesus through the gospel."

Paul had been entrusted with the gospel message—of salvation to be found in Christ, and in Him alone, and he had spent the remainder of his life carefully proclaiming that message to all who would listen to him. He endured great hardships so that the gospel might continue to be spread abroad through the world.

Instead of focusing on whose teaching they were following, whether Paul or Apollos, or someone else, he wanted them to focus on the message of the gospel, and upon the main subject of the gospel, Jesus Christ Himself. "Turn your eyes upon Jesus, look full in His wonderful face, and the things of earth will grow strangely dim in the light of His glory and grace.
